### July 28th Mount Rushmore—

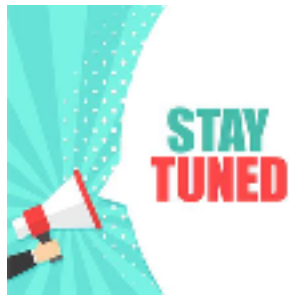
